- 4 Sketch a game idea & test it.

Getting Started

The Journey of Tabletop Game Creations

- Warm-Up
- 2 Explore Game Mechanics
- 3 Brainstorm Cultural Themes
- Prototype & Playtest
- Share & Celebrate

Materials Needed

- Basic: Paper, markers, dice, tokens (coins, buttons), blank cards.
- Optional: Stickers, figurines, cultural image cards.
- Tech Tool: Use AI assistants or online resources for brainstorming help.

Step-by-Step Facilitation

1. Warm-Up

Goal

Spark curiosity about game design.

Play a Short Game

Use a culturally-themed card game or trivia.

Discuss

- · What made this game fun?
- · What rules or parts stood out?

2. Explore Game Mechanics

Teach Basics

Age 8–12: Simple mechanics (dice rolls, card draws).

CHALLENGE

Design a game where dice moves collect special cultural tokens!

Age 13+: Advanced pairs (e.g., dice + trading).

CHALLENGE

Create a game where players trade resources to complete cultural tasks.

3. Brainstorm Cultural Themes

Activity Ideas Theme Mashup: Combine two cultural elements (e.g., Harvest Festival +

Local Legends).

Story Prompts

- · What if our town landmark had magical powers?
- Design a game about preserving a traditional craft!

Tool

Create a Cultural Sparks slideshow with images of traditions, places, and stories.

4. Prototype & Playtest

Steps

Sketch

A board, cards, or characters.

2 Rules

Write 3-5 simple rules (e.g., "Roll dice to move; draw a card for challenges").

Build

Use household items as game pieces.

- Playtest
 - · Ask: What was fun? What was confusing?
 - · Iterate: Simplify or add twists.

5. Share & Celebrate

Pitch Time

- Have kids present their game in 3 minutes.
- Feedback Prompts
 - What surprised you about your game?
 - · What would you add next?

Basic Action	Interaction	Cultural Twist	Example
Dice rolling	Hidden roles	Local Festival	Players take on secret roles to organize the festival.
Card drafting	Resource trading	Traditional Crafts	Trade materials to complete handmade items.
Tile placement	Team cooperation	Community Landmarks	Work together to build a town square.

Family Game Night

Playtest each other's creations.

Community Showcase

Host a mini game expo with friends or neighbors.
